DOOR COUNTY, WI, March 29, 2024 – The <u>League of Women Voters of Door County</u> wants to ensure all county residents are ready to vote in 2024 elections. Following are several upcoming LWVDC events where people can update voter registration, check voter status, and register for the first time:

- Thursday, April 4, 11:30 a.m. 1 p.m., Door County ADRC, 916 N. 14th Ave., Sturgeon Bay (ongoing, first Thursday of the month except July 4)
- Tuesday, April 9, 11 a.m. 1 p.m., Northeast Wisconsin Technical College, 229 N 14th Ave, Sturgeon Bay
- Wednesday, April 10, 11 a.m. 1 p.m. Northeast Wisconsin Technical College, 2438 S Bay Shore Dr, Sister Bay

New or updated voter registration might be necessary if someone moved, had a name change, recently became a U.S. citizen, or did not vote in the past four years. Elections in 2024 are scheduled as follows: April 2, spring election and presidential primary; August 13, partisan primary; and November 5, general election.
