- In the recent midterms, the state of Wisconsin had a turnout of 61% of all eligible voters one of the top three in the nation.
- Door County November elections were smoothly and efficiently implemented thanks to the 200+ election workers in our county. Hopefully, many of you saw the ad and letter to the editor in the *Peninsula Pulse* that was part of our "Thank you, election workers!" campaign, as well as thank you signs scattered around the county. Thank you notes from the Door County League were delivered to each worker.
- Door County voters were served by the multitude of voter-assist events and activities throughout the county and some very successful candidate forums, providing information about those running for office.
- A state-wide thank you campaign is underway by the LWV of Wisconsin in which post cards will be sent to all 2,584 Municipal and Deputy Clerks in Wisconsin.

- Two successful fall events educated members and non-members about how League operates, the history and operations of local government in the county, and League's efforts to shine a light on that government.

- The Leadership Team is working hard on traditional projects as well as new and exciting endeavors that you will hear more about in the new year.

The program is based on a recent publication of Wisconsin Green Fire, a non-partisan organization whose mission is to advance science-informed analysis and policy solutions to address Wisconsin's greatest conservation challenges. "Coming Up for Air is an award winning feature drama focusing on the key role caregivers play in promoting family wellness. Coming Up for Air tells the story of ceramic artist Anna Russell and her son Stan, a straight A college student and high diving champion, seeking a spot on the men's 10m Olympic diving team. The pressure and stress to succeed in his high-stakes athletic competitions, while maintaining his A average and a social life, begin to take their toll. Stan begins to unravel, quits the team and disappears. It's up to his mother to track him down and bring him back to wellness. The film takes audiences on an all-too-common journey, highlighting the pressures that are put upon teenagers to succeed and on parents to cope. This film highlights many relevent topics at the present time from parent/child relationships to suicide, depresion and recovery."

Since 2016, the disenfranchisement of our constitutional rights has lit a fire underneath the foundation upon which my mother raised me. Becoming part of the Door County chapter of the LWV is inspiring, and its dedication to our community is something I look forward to being a part of!
