

At our annual meeting, the Door County League had the honor to present our first ever "LWVDC Making Democracy Work Award." We were delighted to award it to the leaders and participants in the YMCA Youth in Government Program.

In the Y's program, students from Door County schools in grades 8 to 12 are eligible to learn how government works from the perspectives of the legislators, judges, and journalists/media. # LWVDC Legislative Subcommittee Update.

On June 7, members of the LWVDC Legislative Committee (Susan Kohout, Dan Powers, Betsy Rossburg, and Barb Sanja) met via Zoom with members from the Greater Green Bay and Manitowoc Leagues to discuss a regional advocacy approach to lobbying for a NE Wisconsin Crisis Stabilization Facility. This a follow-up action initiated by the Legislative Committee seeking a collective approach to procuring a stabilization facility. It comes after meetings with Joel Kitchens and Andre Jacque as well as with the Door County Health & Family Services director, the county sheriff, and city of Sturgeon Bay police chief.

The collective LWV groups will research specifics as to the status of existing facilities and allocated monies in the last and current state budgets. They will meet again on August 30 to decide the next steps.

## Welcome new member, Holly!




